Last Tuesday, Year 4 had a wonderful morning at the West Wyalong High School Orientation.

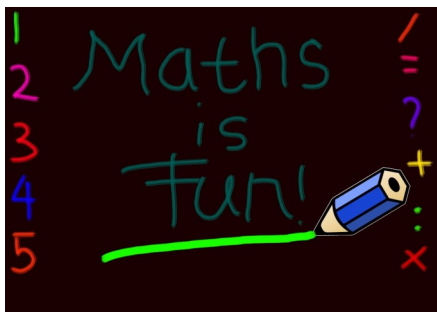
Amelia, Willow and Andrew built towers.
