

Rules of Summer

Rules of Summer is a book about two young boys with a relationship just like any other. The boy aren't the same age, one is older and one is younger. Shaun Tan has made the two boys look really close, like brothers but you could call them friends.



Shaun Tan used colour as a device in this book to make emotion on every page. I believe tan also used color to make the page light or dark. Colour can show you anything like emotion or feeling but don't forget color can point things out. The page I loved the most is the one that said, "Never give your keys to a stranger". Tan used contrasting colours. Red for the small boy who was locked out to show he was very angry. Whereas the cat and the big boy are in light blue which represents clam. I believe Tan did this to show both boys' feelings.

Shaun Tan applied gaze as a device to show the reader where to look. Tan also used gaze because it can make people look directly at something. For example on the page where the boy is arguing with the referee Tan used the offering gaze. I believe Tan used gaze because he thought as soon as the reader opens to the page they would look at the boy and then follow his gaze to the umpire who is the older boy.





Tan also used vector. Vector is a line that leads your eyes from one part of the picture to another. For example, in the Red Rabbit picture the vector is the rabbit's eye to the corner of the clothesline to find the red sock on it. I believe Tan used vector to make the reader look at everything on the page not just one part.

Overall I rate this book 3 out of 5 because Tan used lots of visual literacy devices but there is not enough writing for me to understand the story.

RULES OF SUMMER

'Rules of Summer' is picture book that has a series of different settings. It's written and illustrated by Shaun Tan. There are two boys, some people think they're brothers or friends but all we know is that they have a good relationship. One of them is older than the other. I would rate this book 4/5.



Tan used setting as a visual literacy device on the first page. Setting is where and when the story takes place. The setting on the first page of 'Rules of Summer' is like they are in a warzone. It's dark, scary and

dangerous. Shaun used this setting to make the reader think that this will be scary or something bad is going to happen. Shaun used a variety of scenes to show the reader what is happening, and the boys change in their events and moods.

Gaze was another device Shaun used. Gaze is where the character is looking. Shaun only used the offering gaze, that is where the character is not looking at the reader. I believed he used the offering gaze to make the reader look around for all the details. Shaun used gaze where the birds are looking at the boy who is trying to take the last olive. Shaun used gaze to point out what the birds are looking at.



Shaun Tan used color as a device. It is used on the page where the boy is arguing with the referee. The color is red which shows anger. It's a warm color which could mean he is angry. The black colour in the background also suggests anger and fear.


