The Respiratory System

Did you know that if you did not have a respiratory system, you would be dead because it is our lungs? The respiratory system is important in your body. Your lungs are the only organ that floats on water. Lungs look like red spongy items in your body. The lungs are not the same size, because the left lung is smaller to make room for the heart. If the respiratory system wasn't real and functioning correctly, we would be dead because it helps us breath. **Ashley Year 3**

Did you know that our body is a complex biological network that hold cells, bones, organs and systems that work together? There are eleven major systems including the nervous system, respiratory system, immune system, skeletal system, and lots more that work together to keep our body working. The systems ensure blood flows, lungs inhale oxygen and exhale carbine dioxide. All these systems help to protect our body from outside invaders and allow us to function for everyday life.

Respiratory system

Have you ever thought about that all animals have a respiratory system in their body? It is the only part of the body that can handle the flow of O2, oxygen, so we can breathe. Oxygen is necessary for cell metabolism which gives us our energy. The main organ of the respiratory system is the lungs. They also allow humans to breathe in fresh air and breath out carbine dioxide. If we didn't have our respiratory system, we would suffocate because there would be no oxygen in our body so we can survive.

The muscular system is a collection of muscles, tendon and ligaments. The muscular system works very closely with the skeletal system to make it possible to move. There are over 650 muscles in the human body. The heart, cardiac muscle, is an involuntary muscle, meaning it works without you needing to think. The muscles that allow you to move your arms and your legs are called voluntary muscles which are controlled by the brain. The largest muscle in the body is the gluteus maximus. While the muscular system is interesting, it would not work without the nervous system.

What is the nervous system? The nervous system, brain, nerves, spinal cord, controls the entire body, from the muscles providing movement, to what you say. It does this by using electricity and nerve cells, which are called neurons. The only organ that is inside of the nervous system is the brain. When you exercise, a chemical is released that is called serotonin. The nervous system is one of the most important systems in the body.

The Skeletal System

The skeletal system is the system that prevents us from becoming fleshy puddles. The skeletal system, bones, cartilage, ligaments and tendons, provides structure in your body and protects your vital organs. The adult skeletal system has 206 bones, while a baby has 350 soft bones that fuse together eventually. All the bones in your skeleton have marrow in it, and although it may sound disgusting, marrow is edible and very good for you. If you continue to eat and drink dairy products, like milk and cheese, your bones will continue to harden so the bones in your body do not break. Since the ribs in your skeleton protects your lungs, getting hit in the chest doesn't have to be terrible, you may just be a little short of breath.

The Human body is a fascinating collection of systems, that work together to keep the body functioning. Today we will be learning about three of the 11 systems in the human body that keep it running.

Did you know that the skeletal system is an important part of our body? The skeletal system, bones, ligaments, tendons, provides the body its structure and without it we could not stand or even move. It also protects the internal organs such as the brain, heart and lungs. When a baby is born it has 350 soft bones, but as humans grows, they fuse together to make 206 adult bones. The outside of the bones is hard, but the inside is soft and spongy and contains marrow. Marrow is where the platelets, red blood cells and white blood cell are made. Although the skeletal system is an essential system in the human, there are others important systems in the body such as the nervous system.
