Our ANZAC memorial garden is located at the front of the school, with a footpath guiding visitors through the different countries where past Toppy students made the ultimate sacrifice during World War I.

A special thank you to Mr. Mason for visiting on Friday to help Jayne and I plan this meaningful addition to our school. Mr. Mason, an ex-serviceman and former General Assistant and teacher at Wyalong Public School, designed the front garden between 2016 and 2020. He also documented its history and the stories of the boys it commemorates, ensuring their memory lives on.
